TERESA AMARAL

*Skin Cancer Center
University of Tuebingen
Tuebingen, Germany*

Prof. Amaral finished her MD at Lisbon University in 2006, simultaneously with her degree in Aeronautic Medicine at the Portuguese Air Force. In 2007 she did her general internship at Centro Hospitalar Lisboa Norte and Hospital Pulido Valente in Lisbon, and in 2008 she started her Medical Oncology Internship. This internship was interrupted in 2009 when she was stationed at the Azores Air Base as part of the Portuguese Air Force medical team for the Air Base. During this time, she was also part of the Portuguese Air Force Medical Evacuation Team. She finished her Medical Oncology residency in 2013, and she is a specialist in Medical Oncology since 2014.

In 2016, she started her Ph.D. at the Skin Cancer Center in Tuebingen, Germany, under the supervision of Prof. Claus Garbe. She defended her Ph.D. thesis on the “Progress in systemic therapy of advanced melanoma between 2011 and 2019” at the Nova Medical School in Lisbon in June 2021, Magna cum Laude. Since 2018, she has been responsible for the biobank from the Skin Cancer Center in Tuebingen, and since 2022, she is also the Head of the Skin Cancer Clinical Trials Center in Tuebingen. Her main research focus is biomarkers associated with response to systemic therapy in advanced melanoma, particularly in patients with brain metastases.

Besides her clinical activity, Dr. Amaral is also Chair of the ESMO Leadership Committee, a member of the ESMO Melanoma and other skin cancers faculty, subject editor of the ESMO guidelines for Melanoma and other skin cancers, and a member of the ESMO-MCBS extended working group.

Stacey A. Cohen is a GI medical oncologist at Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center and the University of Washington, specializing in gastrointestinal cancers with a focus on colorectal, early-onset, and hereditary forms. She is the co-Director of the Colorectal Cancer and Peritoneal Cancers (HIPEC) multi-disciplinary clinics.

Dr. Cohen earned her M.D. at the University of Michigan, completed her residency in Internal Medicine at the same institution, and pursued a fellowship in Medical Oncology at UW/Fred Hutch. She is board certified in Medical Oncology by the American Board of Internal Medicine.

Dr. Cohen's research investigates molecular and genetic markers of disease, including circulating tumor DNA (ctDNA) and other blood-based biomarkers, to refine and personalize cancer therapy. She has applied her interest in genetics to ongoing studies of ctDNA as a novel predictor of outcome, treatment response, and treatment selection.

By studying both inherited and tumor-specific genetic alterations, she seeks to improve treatment precision, enhance patient outcomes, and minimize side effects.

Nicola Dinapoli has a keen interest in the applications of radiotherapy imaging, magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) and treatment planning, with focus to adaptive radiotherapy, as well as in the potential of artificial intelligence to support personalized cancer care. He has a multidisciplinary background with expertise in advanced computer programming, statistics, and modeling, particularly applied to the development of applications aimed at supporting clinical practice.

He previously worked in the Department of Breast Tumours at the Cancer Institute "Ion Chiricuta" in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. He holds both the MD and PhD degree in Medical Sciences from the University of Medicine "Iuliu Hatieganu" in Cluj-Napoca.

Dr. Eniu has extensive experience from visits abroad. He was awarded a Mayo Foundation Visiting Clinician Scholarship at the Mayo Breast Cancer Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida and has been a visiting clinician at the MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas and the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York. He did a fellowship at the European Institute of Oncology in Milan. As an active member of both national and international societies, Alexandru Eniu holds positions in various committees. He was appointed in 2018 Deputy Scientific Director of the European School of Oncology after serving for several years as coordinator for the ESO Eastern Europe and Balkan Region Program, and since 2023 he serves as the Chairman of the College of the European School of Oncology. Within ESMO, he chaired the ESMO Global Policy Committee and, between 2014-2018, he was a member of the ESMO Executive Board, leading several initiatives tackling disparities in cancer outcomes across Europe and the world. Within ASCO, he served as chairman of the ASCO International Affairs Committee. Furthermore, he is a member of the editorial board of several oncology journals including Annals of Oncology.

JENNIFER LE GUEVELOU

Dr Jennifer Le Guévelou is currently a PhD student in University of Rennes, France.

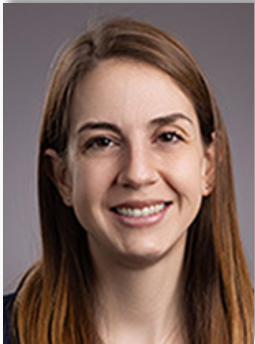
Her training included residency in Normandy, France, where she developed head and neck guidelines, and expertise in protontherapy and brachytherapy.

She performed a fellowship in Geneva, under the guidance of Prof. Thomas Zilli, where she worked on projects including combined hyperthermia and prostate cancer radiotherapy, and the place of SBRT in the management of renal cell carcinoma.

Her primary interest is in genito-urinary oncology, and especially the management of prostate at both an early and metastatic stage. In the past few years, she focused on optimization of treatment planning for prostate cancer radiotherapy, by developing several approaches such as urinary-organs-at risk sparing, and dose-escalation on the dominant intraprostatic lesion (DIL). She is currently the leader of the phase III trial ORION, supported by the GETUG group, assessing the place of dose-escalation on the DIL for patients with high-risk prostate cancer. She is also one of the co-leaders of the prospective meta-analysis FLAMENCO, that will include both Hypoflame3.0, Hypofocal SBRT and ORION trials.

She is also a researcher in head and neck oncology, focusing on both early detection strategies, reduction of toxicity following radiotherapy, and implementation of SBRT in specific disease settings.

Last but not least, her interest includes the management of cancer occurring during pregnancy, both with respect to head and neck and gynecological tumors.

Her main area of work is lung cancer and low gastro-intestinal cancer. In 2019 Mila Petrova defended her thesis on „Role of Neutrophil to Lymphocyte Ratio in pts with advanced NSCLC, treated with first line cytotoxic treatment “.

Since 2014 she is working in the Department of Medical Oncology in Nadezhda Hospital, Sofia, Bulgaria and since 2021 she is the Head of the Department.
