



Prof. Primož Strojani, MD, PhD

Born in 1965 in Ljubljana. He completed his medical studies at the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Ljubljana (1992), where he also obtained his Master's degree (1995) and his doctorate (1998). He passed his specialist examination in radiotherapy and oncology in 1998. In 2000, he completed his training at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Institute in Melbourne, Australia. In 2012, he was appointed full professor at the University of Ljubljana.

Since 1993, he has worked at the Institute of Oncology in Ljubljana, where he was Head of the Department of Radiotherapy from 2002 to 2011 and led a multidisciplinary team for the treatment of head and neck cancers. Since 2001, he has worked at the Faculty of Medicine, where he was appointed full professor in 2012 and headed the Chair of Oncology from 2013 to 2021.

He has been a professional associate of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) since 2005. In 2008-2010 he was a member of the Board of the European Society for Radiotherapy and Oncology (ESTRO) and since 2009 he has been a member of the International Head and Neck Scientific Group. The main areas of his professional and scientific work are: Cancers of the head and neck, melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancers, organizational aspects of radiotherapy. Since 2017, he has been leading the project group for the establishment of proton radiotherapy in Slovenia at the Institute of Oncology. He is the head of the research program of the Slovenian Research and Innovation Agency (ARIS) entitled "Head and Neck Cancer: Analysis of Biological Characteristics and Attempts to Improve Treatment" and editor of three international journals in the field of oncology. His bibliography comprises 279 articles in peer-reviewed journals and the editorship of two university textbooks.
